PASTOR'S CORNER

I was drawn to the opening of a magazine article. Does this ring true for you?

"We live in a work-conscious era. We are all of us under constant pressure to get more done, to increase efficiency. Now work is an excellent thing in its way and by devotion to it the human race has produced a host of achievements. But work can also become an obsession...We turn into work-ridden neurotics, and we forget that *How to Get More Done* can be a very vicious knowledge unless it is balanced with an equal knowledge of *How to Do Nothing*."

The article continues on to note, that without balance and reservoirs of quiet we won't be able to "tap certain ancient wellsprings of the spirit... to draw the strength to stand up against the clatter of our industrial world." This article comes from a 1939 Readers Digest!

November and December are busy months. Many employees begin to cope with the push of fiscal year end. Stores fill as shoppers search for gifts. There is more cooking and cleaning to be done in preparation for the holidays. 



Seeking to initiate a Spirit-led vision and understanding of our community; ignite faith into action, and invigorate people to pursue God's call for our lives and community.

Well - it has been nine months since we received the first report that indicated that our congregation was ready reach new people in new ways so that we could multiply our impact in our community. Our team is faithfully learning, listening, and trying to understand our community, congregation and God's call.

1-1 conversations with church members and people in the community have been most helpful. These 15-20 minute chats build relationships by helping us understand what concerns and motivates individuals, and what skills they may have to work on such issues.

Surveys are also a useful tool for understanding the congregation. Recently we offered a Core Values Survey online and in-person. We wanted to discover the top five core values that people believe are important to our church. 61 people participated which represents approximately 42% of our active members.

Altogether, our congregation's top five values, in order, beginning with the most important are:

- 1) **Preaching and Teaching Scripture** (Communicating God's Word to people)
- 2) **Prayer** (Communication with God)
- 3) **Inclusiveness** (There is a place for everyone)
- 4) **Worship** (Attributing worth to God through preaching/prayer/music)
- 5) **Encouragement** (Giving hope to people who need some hope)

In this liminal time caused by COVID-19 disruptions, we are hoping to discern, with your input and engagement, God's next call for our congregation. Please watch for opportunities to engage with the Catalyst Initiative process.

The next step in the initiative is to connect the community's voice, the congregation's gifts and passions, and the focuses of the Church's leaders into "Our Mission Possible", a design thinking tool for church and social change. We will be applying for a \$250 grant and then later a \$5000 grant that will help fuel our new vision.

Please pray that God will teach all of us to dare, to remember, and to love. May our people become catalysts of hope and thriving in the church and the world.




